Team leader Zack (Andrew Wilson Williams) takes Rafer under his wing despite taunting from their rivals, the Hawks. Their Coach (John Schneider, The Dukes of Hazzard, October Baby), manager Rebecca (Sydney Morgan Layne), and the rest of the Robins encourage Rafer as the team rises towards an unlikely championship season, that is less about winning and losing and more about living and dying. Warner, former Liberian Vice President. The life of Bishop Warner demonstrates how a small seemingly insignificant event in our lives can transform our lives and the lives of countless others. The documentary's title comes from Warner's childhood desire to learn to read and write-to put "Black Marks on White Paper," as he described to his father what he had seen others do. Bishop Warner's experience of seeing someone place "Black Marks on White Paper" motivated him to seek the education that would lead him to become an educator, Bishop, Vice President of his native land, and eventually a missionary to America. In the wake of several personal setbacks, Taylor faced federal incarceration, substance addiction and homelessness, in a 25-year struggle to recover his health, reputation, and family. Coach Bo Schembechler is prominent in Taylor's story. Interview subjects include former coach Gary Moeller, as well as teammates David Brandon, Thom Darden and several others. Members of the Taylor family are central subjects in a compelling narrative that builds to an inspirational conclusion. PERSEVERANCE touches on themes of recovery, loyalty, parenting, and faith.
